## MINUTES

## 1. Welcome and Apologies

SN welcomed all and apologies were noted. It was noted Christmas and Covid challenges may explain poor attendance.

2. Bowness Festival of Food. Arts and Culture

SN welcomed Tim Keenen to the meeting and everyone introduced themselves.

Tim provided an overview of the proposed Bowness Festival of Food, Arts and Culture which he summarised as an event that aims to:

- provide an inclusive platform for local people, businesses, charities, artists of all genres and educational bodies to showcase their talents, produce, work and causes. Raising local and national awareness of what they are about.
- To provide the people of south Cumbria and beyond with an event that is fun and is accessible to all.
- To create a sustainable and progressive event that offers enterprise and opportunity for all.
- To create a space for education, demonstration and debate on numerous local issues, such as food, conservation, sustainability, the environment, the arts, hospitality, gardening and mental health.

Tim explained that the festival would take place over a weekend utilising both the Glebe and Cockshott Point. The event would be for the towns benefit rather than for profit. BWF agreed that part of their role is to champion local events and would therefore happily support this venture where possible.
